Background and objectives

The workshop has an essential role in the ESPON project 'Territorial Approaches for New GOvernance' (ESPON TANGO). The project delves deeply into the conceptualisation and operationalisation of territorial governance across Europe.

The aim is to provide evidence to support future territorial development policies in general and Cohesion Policies to improve regional competitiveness, social inclusion and sustainable and balanced growth of the European territory in particular.

The ESPON TANGO project assesses current trends in territorial governance and develops a robust typology and a framework of good governance practices. The required information has been gathered in particular through a dozen in-depth case studies.

A central goal of the project is to identify and deduce innovative and transferable practices of territorial governance across Europe that shall be synthesised and disseminated in a policy-relevant 'Handbook of Territorial Governance'.

The outcomes of the workshop will be used to make this Handbook as relevant and user-friendly as possible.

In short, the workshop has five main objectives:

- To involve the main target group of the Handbook of Territorial Governance, namely decision-makers, practitioners and policy-makers with a stake in territorial development.
- To identify and discuss the characteristics of good territorial governance and ways to transfer them based on 12 case studies from across Europe.
- To distil good territorial governance practices for achieving smart, inclusive and sustainable growth.
- To help participants detect channels and mechanisms from which to learn.
- To receive suggestions for a relevant and user-friendly Handbook on good Territorial Governance.

The ESPON TANGO project is supported by the ESPON 2013 Programme, which is part-financed by the European Regional Development Fund, the EU Member States and the Partner States Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland. ESPON shall support Cohesion Policy development with European wide, comparable information, evidence, analyses and scenarios on framework conditions for the development of regions, cities and larger territories.
